Ordinance Highlight

Planning & Zoning #267



The City of Holstein reminds residents, property owners, and contractors that all building projects, property changes, and land use activities must comply with the City's Planning & Zoning Ordinance.

✦ A zoning permit or building permit may be required for projects such as:
New construction or demolition; Accessory buildings, fences, decks, or sidewalks; Sign installation; Excavation or work in the public right-of-way; Rezoning, variances, or conditional uses.

💡 Tip: Contact City Hall before starting a project to ensure proper permits are obtained and to avoid delays or additional fees.
